DREAMM aims to develop a mentoring methodology to implement a two-way integration model for newly arrived Third Country Nationals (TCNs) and local communities taking the intercultural dimension into account.

Peer-to-peer learning events and jointly agreed social activities are implemented to:

- reach a better mutual understanding of the other's values and behaviours
- foster a sense of belonging to a community
- mitigate stereotypes, discrimination, xenophobia, and racism
- improve TCNs' understanding of local services.
